The BEST WEB Hosting?

If you are serious about your business, you really need to be serious about your hosting!

But which hosting company or web hosting plan is the best one for you? In this guide, we are going to answer this question.



So Which hosting company?

This is a GREAT questions, but unfortunately, it does not have a one unified answer!

Technology develops and progresses almost on a daily basis and what's hot today may not be what's good tomorrow or be the most suitable for your business needs.

So instead of recommending specific website hosting companies here and there,

I have decided to take a more scientific approach, and share with you my special website hosting guide/checklist.

This will show you exactly what you need in a good hosting plan,

what to look for and how to compare an apple to an apple! It will help you determine the best hosting provider "for you" as well as the most suitable plan to make your website a success!



I have been helping people do business and be more successful online since 2002.

My aim is to take the "Tech.Pain" away from entrepreneurs so that they can focus on their customers.

What to look for in a good hosting company:

- Conduct a search on Google maps to find their office address (they may have more than one)
- Check their customer reviews on Google maps and also check if they respond to reviews. (you generally want to see more than 100 reviews and not all of them are 5 stars!)
- Ask around in your network / social media to see if someone you know has been using them.
- Check their about page to see how long they have been in the hosting business and if they have listed their addresses and phone numbers.
- It's an excellent bonus if the hosting provider has more than one data center in different regions of the country or the world.
- Good customer support (look for a variety of support channels like web chat, online support tickets etc., social media support or phone support will be an added bonus.) P.S. YOU can try their online chat before you buy, this way you can experience their speed of response.
- Uptime guarantees.
- Good money back guarantee (the longer the guarantee period, the better)

What to avoid:

- Hosting companies that don't appear to have a physical location.
- Dirt cheap hosting.
- Companies offering a "lifetime" plan for only one payment.
- DO NOT pay for your hosting for more than 1 year, there is a chance that you will want to change plans or move to another "better" hosting company as your business grows.

• Full SSD:

SSD stands for "solid-state drive" an SSD is a disk or a drive that is way faster and better than the old style mechanical drives, this greatly affects the speed of your website

(P.S. beware of some hosting companies who only use SSD for the database, you want it all to be on SSD not just the DB!)

• Minimum 1GB of memory:

Some hosting companies don't disclose this memory info in shared hosting (you can have a chat with their sales before buying and ask about this) and others don't guarantee any specific memory resources If you are planning to have WordPress website you need a minimum of 1GB memory for your account. (While WordPress works well on the majority of shared hosting accounts "even those with 512MB", there are many actions and tasks that need memory resources, like backups, cron jobs, image compression, and of course the Divi Builder – if you use Divi, Having more memory will make your site run faster and will save you a lot of lag time on the WordPress and Hosting Cpanel dashboards in general.)

• Full control over the PHP version and the extensions or modules:

This is pretty much a standard in all Cpanel based hosting, but not

available if you choose a "managed hosting" plan. Many themes or plugins need specific PHP modules loaded in order to run, plus in this specific settings area you get to assign some limits to your PHP like memory limit (the more the better), post size and max upload size, script execution time etc.

• LiteSpeed server, or LiteSpeed caching support on the back end:

This enables you to use caching on the server and acheive better pageload speed optimization for your website.

• HTTP2/HTTP3 protocol:

These are the modern standards of the hyper text transfer protocol-http, that we use when browsing the web, they are faster and better than http.

But not all website hosting companies use them.

- **Choice of Data centers** on East coast as well as West coast (US/Canada), Europe, Asia etc. (You need to chose the data center that is closer to where most of your customers are located "not you", so if you are based in New York but most of your customers are in Japan, you need a data center in Japan or somewhere in Asia!)
- Availability of support and how fast they respond (what is their promise to the customer – to respond within how long?) You can google them and you can also check their reviews on Google maps.
- What are the limitations of the plan? (any traffic/ transfers limitation? Any limit on the No. of sites or No. of data bases? What about the system's resources like CPU, memory, Inodes etc.) And what happens if you go over the limit? Do they slow the sites down? Do suspend the account? Some hosting companies are notorious for not allowing any account to go over the resources even for 5-10 minutes and they throttle that right away! (while this might look like a fair practice, some tasks like backing up your website can result in a sudden surge in usage of the CPU/Memory

for a few minutes – once a day, if your hosting does not allow this, your backups would fail!)
